SCREENING SUCCESS STORY

DUQUESNE UNIVERSITY, FOOD
BANK, JUST HARVEST & YMCA

Duquesne University School of Pharmacy, in partnership with the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, Just Harvest and the YMCA hosted 41 health screening events at 15 locations throughout REACH communities. In all, 610 people received screenings for chronic diseases, such as high cholesterol, diabetes, high blood pressure. Of those screened, 312 people identified as Black/African American. Additionally, tobacco (115 AA) and food insecurity (67 AA) screenings were conducted. Health professionals provided flu shots to 38 people; 22 of which were Black/African American. During

the outreach events, 324 patients—197 of which were Black/African American—to locally available health and preventive programs. During the COVID-19 pandemic, REACH launched virtual smoking cessation classes and virtual medication therapy management service.
